



Reference citations in text:

Quotations should be placed in footnotes and not in the main text.

In case of quotation of a sentence, text should be in between inverted commas «» and should be reported the reference in the footnote as follows: Author 1985, 23.

Reference citations in footnotes:

Green 2004, 120-121.

Green - White - Red 2012, 64, fig 4.

References in a phrase in footnotes are between brackets (Author 1985, 23).

In the case of four or more authors, they must be quoted with the name of the first Author et al. (Author et al. 2002, 65).

Cross-references: (§ number of paragraph) es.: (§ 2.1.)

Bibliographic references at the end of the text: Times New Roman 9, according to formats in examples below:
